



Network slicing



New policy objectives

-Near ubiquitous coverage

- Indoor, roads and rail, geographic targets

— Consistent levels of quality and experience — Minimum speeds, throughput, latency

-The industrial internet

- Public and private sector efficiencies, disintermediation, innovation

Challanges

Spectrum supply and cost

"We can only spend each Euro once: either on spectrum or network build-out. My suggestion would be on buildout." - DT CEO Tim Hoettges

Deployment bottlenecks "Governments should consider spectrum policy as means of delivering critical national infrastructure rather than an income source" - Ericsson CEO Börje Ekholm

Specialized services regulation

"We need for a regulatory regime that allows service providers to create services that are differentiated based on user experience." - Ericsson CEO Börje Ekholm

Assignment considerations

- Extending market performance parameters
 - France 4G renewal: ubiquitous 8 Mpbs by 2020, 30 Mpbs by 2023
 - Germany 5G auction: 100 Mpbs to 98% of the population by 2022
 - Italy....
- Reconsider assignment principles to extend market performance
 - Auctions with obligations
 - Spectrum fees as an investment fund
 - Fee waivers for investments "vive la French"
 - Annual fee structures to incentivise investment
